

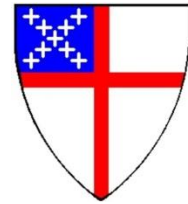

In today's dynamic cultural environment, churches have to be more than faithful—they have to be agile. That means embracing processes of trial, failure, and adaptation as they form Christian community with new neighbors. And that means a whole new way of being church.

Taking one page from the Bible and another from Silicon Valley, priest and scholar Dwight Zscheile brings theological insights together with cutting-edge thinking on organizational innovation to help churches flourish in a time of profound uncertainty and spiritual opportunity. Picking up where his recent bestseller, *People of the Way* left off, Zscheile answers urgent and practical questions around how churches become agile and adaptive to meet cultural change.

I am the vine, you are the branches. From Deb Kuenzi, our Parish Rooster

70% of Haitians are unemployed; Haiti's potential as a self-sustaining country rests, in part, with economy building: job creation, product improvement, income diversification, and opening up markets for Haitian goods like coffee.

Our Goal: to drink delicious Haitian coffee because it supports Haiti's economy and people buy coffee – so why not Haitian? Second, we use it to raise money for our work in Haiti – a 25+ year outreach of Episcopal churches in Wisconsin. **We've raised OVER \$30,000 JUST through coffee sales.** This money helps support our work in Jeannette Haiti: a clinic, a school, a church.

Singing Rooster provides us with fresh roasted coffee and is doing great work in Haiti. We buy it wholesale, and you've never seen numbers like this: **Over 66%** (\$6.50) from EACH bag of coffee directly supports Haiti -- \$3.50/lb through S. Rooster, \$3/bag through you / us. **This is significant.**

Many use the Rooster's coffee parish-wide at fellowship hour, and parish-level coffee roasters hold special sale fundraisers: church bazaars, holiday fairs, festivals, when the bishop visits!

Spring Rummage Sale

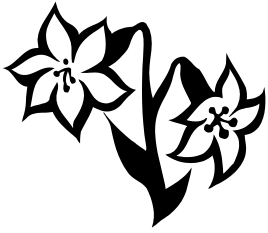

New this year @ St. Mark's for the Lenten Season



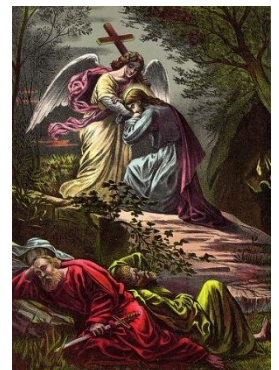

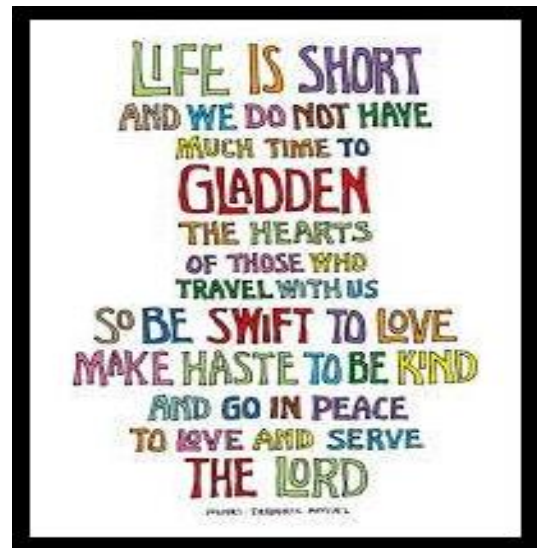



**St. Mark's Episcopal Church
Special Congregation Meeting Minutes
January 14,2018**

Senior Warden Dan Hilbert introduced the second reading of the proposed change in St. Mark's by-laws item #4 to the congregation.

The current item #4 by-law reads "The Vestry consists of 9 Vestry members, 1 Senior Warden and 1 Junior Warden. The Vestry members are elected at the Annual Parish Meeting, three each year for a three year term. The Wardens are elected annually at the same meeting for their one year term. The Wardens can succeed themselves for a total of three terms, and then they must be off the Vestry for at least one year, after which they may return. Vestry members may serve two full terms (not including partial terms) then they must sit out for at least one year, after which they may return. The Vestry meets monthly for its regular meetings and at others times as needed. Special meetings are called according to the diocesan canon."

The proposed item #4 by-law reads "The Vestry consists of **5** Vestry members, 1 Senior Warden and 1 Junior Warden. The Vestry members are elected at the Annual Parish Meeting, **two each year except for every third year where only one is elected for a three year term.** The Wardens are elected annually at the same meeting for their one year term. The Wardens can succeed themselves for a total of three terms, and then they must be off the Vestry for at least one year, after which they may return. Vestry members may serve two full terms (not including partial terms) then they must sit out for at least a year, after which they may return. The Vestry meets monthly for its regular meetings and at other times as needed. Special meetings are called according to the diocesan canon."

After a question clarifying election of Vestry members, Senior Warden Hilbert called for a motion to approve the change. Motion made by Lindsey Cleary and seconded by Bob Zamzow to replace the current by-law #4 with the proposed one. Motion carried.

Meeting called to order by Sr. Warden Dan Hilbert at 10:30 am

1. Opening devotion by Fr. Rozo. Each member was asked to give the good and sad things in their lives.
2. Approval of the November and December, 2017 minutes – Motion by Andy H. to approve the minutes from the November and December meetings as presented and seconded by Darci M. Motion carried.
3. Treasurer's Report – Fred E. briefly reviewed the financial report from November 2017. Motion by Lindsey C. and seconded by Linda Z. to approve the November financial report. Motion carried. Fred then reviewed the December financial report. 2017 ended on a good note. Revenue was over the budgeted amount and several areas were under budget allowing for carry over into 2018. Motion by Lindsey C. and seconded by Darci M. to approve the December financial report. Motion carried. Fred presented the 2018 budget as put together by the Finance Committee. All lines were reviewed. A new line is being added to the 2018 budget. This line is to establish a furnace fund. One furnace currently needs a new motor. At some point the furnaces will need to be replaced. This line item will be added to with every budget instead of waiting until new ones are needed. Parishioners will be able to donate to this fund if interested. The 2018 budget while not balanced has no excess factored in. Motion by Lindsey C. and seconded by Jody L. Motion carried. This will be presented to the congregation at the Annual Meeting.
4. Old Business -
 - a. Parochial Report – Fr. Oscar has not received it yet. It is usually due in February.
5. New Business –
 - a. Issues from Rev. Oscar, Senior Warden:
 1. Vestry Elections – Elections for Sr. Warden, Jr. Warden, 2 or 3 Vestry members, a trustee and convention delegates will be needed at the Annual Meeting. Jim M. and Jody L. have another year to serve on Vestry. There is interest in the other positions from parishioners.
 2. Annual Meeting Reports – There are still outstanding reports needed. Jody L. will take care of the Columbarium report and the Stewardship report.
 3. Yoga class - Fr. Oscar reported Elisha Barudin is still interested in using church space for her yoga classes. Participants will be asked to sign a release from liability before participating. There will be no cost unless she starts receiving donations or starts to charge for classes. This idea will be revisited. Motion by Andy H. and seconded by Darci M. to open the building for yoga classes. Motion carried. Other options for building use will be explored.

b. Junior Warden and Committee Reports

i. **Building and Grounds**

- a. Furnaces – One of the furnaces needs a new motor. It will be installed tomorrow morning.
- b. Projects for 2018 – Jr. Warden Ken P. talked about some projects for this year; modernize food pantry, front entry, and add a sound system to downstairs.
- c. Ken took 110 pictures of items in the church for insurance purposes.
- d. New smoke detectors installed per Diocesan report.
- e. C associated are moving to the dry script however Ken would like some help with where the stuff in there should go.
- f. Ken still having conversation with Advance Disposal about not picking up our cardboard. We pay for it but it's not happening.
- g. The Vestry thanked Ken for his hard worked over the last 2 years as Jr. Warden!

ii. **Other Committee Reports - None**

iii. **Other New Business**

- a. Souper Bowl – Will be on February 4th. Kids will be collecting for church for local food pantries.
- b. Annual Meeting dinner – It was decided to do a soup luncheon. Vestry members will provide soups, salads, bread and desserts.
- c. Pancake Breakfast – The pancake breakfast will be on February 11th. It was suggested we offer healthier options in keeping with the Blue Zones project. Lindsey C. will recruit Meredith H. to help out.
- d. Church in the Park – Date not set yet although it will be in August. Park rental is \$45 dollars.
- e. Annual Convention – Date for Annual Convention is October 13th at St. John's Military Academy in Delafield again.

iv. **Fundraising –**

- a. Scrip Update – December Profit – \$227.43.
- b. Brat stand dates – We are scheduled for Saturday May 19th and Friday June 15th. We can only sign up for two until March, then if there are other dates open we could sign up for more. It was decided two is enough.
- c. Rummage Sale – Rummage sale will be April 27th and 28th, a Friday and Saturday.
- d. Profit from fundraisers for needy family - Profit from December scrip, profit from sale of jewelry and profit from the sale of ornaments made by Sunday school kids had been designated to go to a family in need. According to Fr. Oscar that family believed they were ok and turned down the money. Suggestions for use of the money included Church Health Services, PAVE, and Cribs for Kids. Motion by Lindsey C. and seconded by Jody L. to donate the money to Church Health Services and Cribs for Kids equally. The total amount is \$434.43, so each group will receive \$217.21.

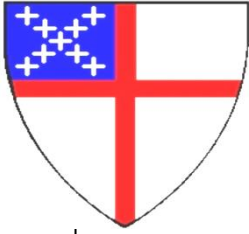
6. Next meeting will be determined after the election of members at the Annual Meeting.

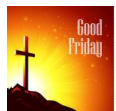
