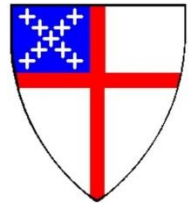

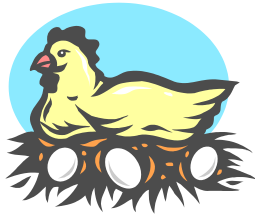

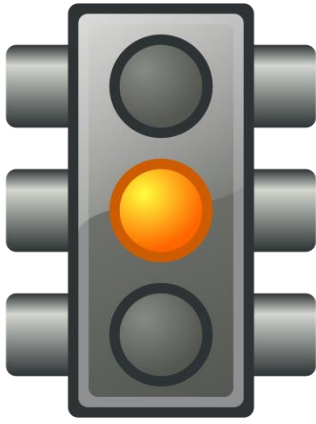

# Vestry Meeting

## April 23, 2017

Also present: Dan Hilbert, Sr. Warden; Rev. Oscar Rozo, Rector; Fred Ellis, Treasurer; Ken Peters, Jr. Warden

Absent: Sue Kuhn

Meeting called to order by Dan H. at 11:02 am.

1. Opening devotion was a prayer shared by Andy H.
2. Approval of the March 18, 2017 minutes – Linda Z. pointed out under Old Business 4c., “2016 Easter flowers” should have read “2016 Christmas flowers”. Motion by Linda Z and seconded by Andy H. to approve the March minutes with the correction. Motion carried.
3. Treasurer’s Report – Fred. E reviewed the balance sheet for February. Fred also reviewed the Profit & Loss for January through March. Pledges and givers of record are still ahead of where they are budgeted. Fred informed the Vestry that we are caught up on Fr. Oscar’s compensation. Fr. Oscar was reminded to turn in mileage for reimbursement. Motion by Lindsey C. to approve the March financial report as presented and seconded by Chris C. Motion carried.
4. Old Business -
  - a. Asbury Clowns – May 21<sup>st</sup> – A reminder that the Clowns will be here on May 21st. Coffee hour will be hosted by the Vestry on that Sunday.
  - b. Vestry Retreat – May 7<sup>th</sup> – The Vestry retreat is May 7<sup>th</sup> at Darcy Mosher’s house from 12:00 to 5:00 pm. It will be a potluck. Fr. Oscar requested that everyone bring an object from their house that represents their spirituality.
  - c. Columbarium By-laws -Tabled until the May meeting.
  - d. Coffee – Chris C. on her conversation with Linda Chipman regarding the Change of Heart store selling our coffee.
  - e. Bakery for the rummage sale – Linda Z encouraged people to bring bakery items as they sell well, except for muffins. Cookies and bars sell the best.
5. New Business –
  - a. Issues from Rev. Oscar, Senior Warden, and others:
    - a.Grants for the elevator? – The suggestions made that since we didn’t qualify for the grant for the elevator, we should look at the building instead. There is a possibility of using the endowment funds or grants to renovate or add on to the building. This was assigned to the Buildings and Grounds Committee.
    - b. New comers – Fr. Oscar talked about starting a group a couple times per year to discuss the history and tenants of the church. He also mentioned a committee addressing issues of youth and young families.
    - c.2017 Vestry Friends List – Dan distributed the Vestry Friends List.
    - d. Singalong – Fr Oscar reported the singalong with First Lutheran went well. There were approximately 27 people in attendance. The hope is to hold these monthly or every other month.
    - e.Pastoral Care Committee – A Pastoral Care Committee is being formed.
  - b. Junior Warden and Committee Reports:
    - a.**Building and Grounds**
      - a) Jr. Warden reported that the neighbor to the west of the church is moving. He is also planning a rummage sale possibility the same weekend as ours.
      - b) All the painting is complete except for the baseboards. Ken thanked everyone who helped with the painting project. It was also suggested something could be done with the front entryway.
      - c) Outside work is almost complete. There may not be a need for a planned spring cleanup.
      - d) The rummage sale is later this week. There a lot of items at the church already.

- e) Dave Drexler fixed the cupboard in the kitchen.
- f) The backs steps need to be repainted but they need to be sand blasted before painting. They have a lot of rust and peeling paint.
- g) There is a party interested in the downstairs piano. Since it is still sometimes used, the suggestion was made to purchase a keyboard for those needs.

b. **Other Committee Reports**

- a) Christian Education – Linda Z reported that the Christian Ed youth are working with St. Paul’s, Watertown on being prayer buddies. The kids like the idea of support. There is also an overnight camping trip to Astico Park July 30<sup>th</sup> and Aug 1<sup>st</sup> with St. Paul’s. The suggestion was made to invite them to Church in the Park

c. **Other New Business**

- a) The question was asked about the upstairs piano. It is out of tune and not in good shape. The comment was made that it can be taken apart and scrapped. Ken P will talk to some members about taking care of that.
- b) Highway clean-up is scheduled for June 4<sup>th</sup> after church with a rain date for June 11<sup>th</sup>.
- c) Darcy M reported on a group working to support diversity. This group is distributing yard signs that say “Hate has no home here”. There are 4 subgroups in this organization. Discussion held on putting a sign in the church lawn. It was decided by consensus that as a church, we support diversity; individuals who may not share that opinion might not feel comfortable worshipping at St. Mark’s. Anyone interested in a yard sign for personal use should see Darcy. There was then discussion about St. Mark’s developing their own sign when “St. Mark’s” across the bottom. There was agreement on that idea.

**I. Fundraising**

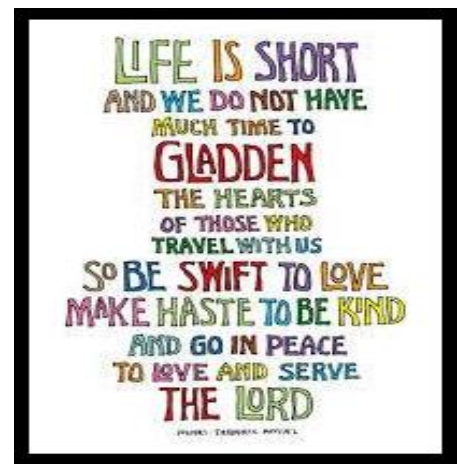
- a) Scrip Update – The March scrip amount was \$164.18

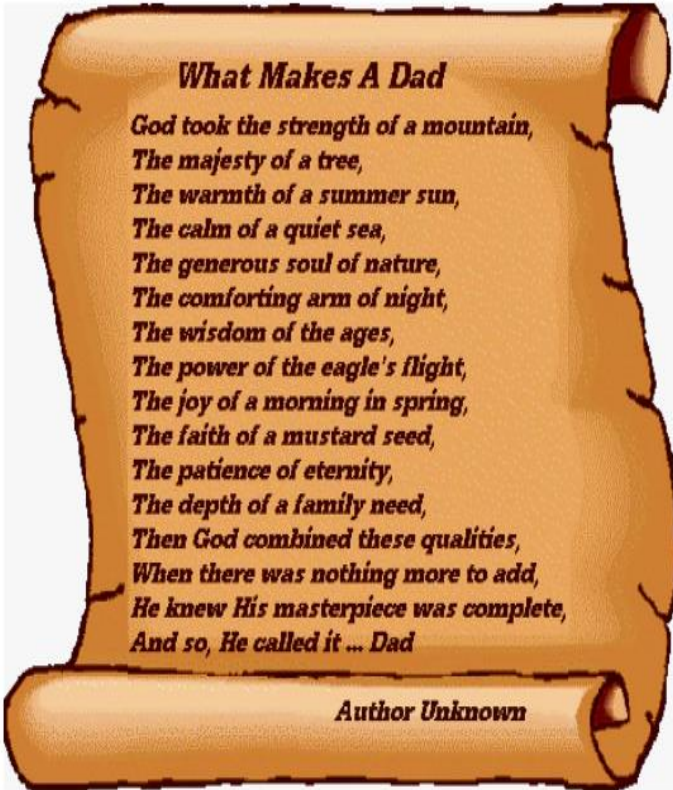

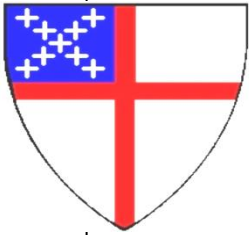
