



I must have been 4-5 years old when I became aware of the unspoken rule of private property. One day while walking around a store I noticed my parents grabbing different food items from the shelves and putting them in their grocery cart. Following their example, I grabbed a candy bar and put it inside my pocket. A few minutes later, right after walking out of the store I took the candy bar out of my pocket and started eating it. As soon as my parents noticed I had stolen a candy bar from the store, they walked me back, they asked me to apologize to the manager and pay for it. I remember my father looking deep into my eyes while explained to me the concept of private property. There are things that belong to the emperor and there are things that belong to God.

This past Sunday at church St. Mark's parishioners took a time to identify those things that belong to the emperor and those things that belong to God. While sharing with each other, I stated that among the many different ways in which we give back to God, the act of communal prayer is to me the most transformative. When two or three gather in prayer, we are reminded we are God's. When two or three gather in prayer, we give to God what belongs to God.

We live in a world that needs to remember our belonging to God. I would like to invite parishioners from St. Mark's to join me once a month and walk outside of the church to knock on people's doors, ask them for their prayers of intercession or thanksgiving and pray with them. 

Saint Mark's in the Digital Age

We don't often associate our parish with high technology, computers or social media, but in 2017 we are very much a part of that. This capability gives us additional tools to enhance our worship, express our faith, utilize powerful learning tools and to extend our ministries to others.

Our pipe organ restoration project included installation of several computer main boards that take the place of old switches and relays, and allow us to manage 30 stops (pipe sounds), keep the organ in tune and to record and reproduce hymns digitally

Our new sound system has built-in capability to project sound equally in all directions within the room, and to tune the same sound with a built-in delay to the narthex, avoiding any "echo" effects. We also have capability to play audio from smart phones, computers and from the internet, and the option to add a hearing loop in the future.

Our parish office utilizes a PC, digital copier, internet modem and network to coordinate office functions. The same computer has server capability to manage audio and video media throughout the building. Our parish network (ATT240) is connected to the internet and makes Wi-Fi available for use within the building. Our Messenger newsletter is also available online.

The video camera in the balcony provides still or video images of the service for streaming or replay on the internet or within the building.

Our big screen TV's are capable of playing audio and video slides and movies from memory cards, the parish network, from the internet or from android or I-phone applications.

We have a parish home page www.stmark-beaverdam.org and a Facebook page with regular entries. Members of the parish also regularly publish parish activities to Facebook and Instagram.

Note that we can always use additional persons to assist in managing these tools. They all require people to implement them and to use them to full advantage. Are you interested in one or more of these areas? Let parish leadership know! We could use you and your ideas and talents. If you are interested, but need training, we can provide it.



Christian Stewardship, **Sandra T. Montes**

Stewardship: a complex word and a difficult concept. Many people prefer not to talk about it, but sometimes it is because they fail to understand what it really is. Stewardship is the management of what God has given us. We usually refer to it as the 3 “T”s: *Talent, Treasure* and *Time*. But there’s a fourth, *Terra* (the creation). Sometimes we forget that we are sons and daughters of God. God has blessed us, blesses us, and will continue to bless us abundantly. Let us think about how God blesses us daily: with time, physical and mental health, energy, talents, possessions, friends,

money, food, home, family...we could continue on and on, am I right? This approach is to be thankful for all the blessings we have. Even our very life is a gift from God. Stewardship is a practice of thankfulness and generosity, and it reflects our walk with God. Our goal is for our faith to grow and to be able to give generously. This goal is a ministry in itself, which we practice while trying to live a life filled with awareness and gratitude.

Being a good steward

God gave each of us talents to use while we are in this world. How do we use our talents to glorify God? One way is to use our individual talents to the best of our ability. As good stewards, we must practice our talents, improve them, and use them as often as we can to share God’s love with all who need it. We have 24 hours in a day and it is up to us to decide how we will use that time. In the past few months there have been several natural disasters, such as hurricanes and earthquakes. Perhaps we can dedicate our time to assist those in need. We can also use our time praying for the needy, the sick, and the suffering. How can we be good stewards of our planet? An easy way is to start turning off the lights when we don’t need them and avoid wasting water. Let us try recycle as much as possible.

A way to express our Christian values is making stewardship a priority in our lives. We can remember this by asking ourselves the following question: “In what way will everything in my life show that I am a Christian?” If we constantly ask ourselves that one question we will see a change in the way we think, act, speak, listen, and give. Everything we do is for the glory of God, even the way we spend our

money. The first thing we have to remember every day is that everything belongs to God. Psalm 24:1 says, “The Earth is the Lord’s, and the fullness thereof; the world, and all those that dwell therein.” In other words, everything belongs to God, everything comes from God and what we do with what God entrusted us is very important.

To become aware of our values we can make an inventory of where we spend our money. Matthew 6:21 says, “For where your treasure is, there will also be your heart.” We can make this inventory of our expenses by simply writing down what we spend our money on over the course of one month. We can divide our expenses into categories; clothing, household needs, cleaning supplies, toiletries, donations, church, travel, food, entertainment, etc. We can then further refine those categories; food (supermarket) and food (restaurants.) That will enable us to see at a glance where our values, treasure, and heart really are.

Faithful stewards of His Gifts

As good stewards we have the responsibility of managing something that doesn’t belong to us (because everything belongs to God). It is a privilege that God gave us and we must manage it with great care. When we talk about stewardship in the Church sometimes we make the mistake of thinking that we are collecting funds, but in fact it is something very different. The Very Rev. Miguelina Howell explains, “Stewardship is a spiritual practice of thanksgiving that helps us get close to God. Collecting funds is a specific activity to collect financial resources for a specific purpose.” This spiritual practice helps us grow as people of faith, while collecting funds help us attain a goal or an objective.

To live a full life, let us practice the stewardship of the four “T”s on a daily basis. Let us think about how we can glorify the name of God through our *Talent*, *Treasure*, *Time* and treatment of the *Terra*. These spiritual practices will bring us closer to God and can continue to make a positive impact even after the end of our physical lives. A way to be a good steward of what God gives us is to make plans for the end of our lives in this world. The Spanish-language ECF booklet on planning for the end of life titled “Faithful Stewards of His Gifts” can help you decide how you wish your worldly assets to be distributed, to give you peace of mind and relieve your loved ones from the burden of having to make those decisions on your behalf. The plans for your estate and the end of your life should reflect your values. This booklet will also help you learn how you can leave a legacy gift to your church.



Saint Mark's Bell



This past month our parish bell was given a well-deserved cleaning and the metal structure was refinished, thanks to Dave Drexler and Ken Peters. Well deserved, because this bell has called the faithful to worship for over 150 years! It was cast in Troy, New York in 1865 and given to Saint Mark's parish by a group of businessmen who were friends and former parishioners of the Rev. R. F. Sweet, an early rector at Saint Mark's (1860-1865), who also came from New York. This 37 inch bell was cast in bronze by a renowned foundry, Jones and Co. Founders, and has an excellent ring tone. However, Father Sweet's name was miss-spelled on the bell as the Rev. Sweit, and

could not be corrected. It formerly hung in the bell tower at old Saint Mark's and was moved to the present location in the 1970's. An electronic ringing mechanism replaced the old rope ringing apparatus (displayed on the narthex wall) at that time. It can be set to ring with a time clock and by the ushers with a button in the narthex. Ring on, sweet bell, or is it sweit bell?

Meeting called to order by Dan H. at 10:40 am.

1. Opening devotion was done by Fr. Oscar.
2. Approval of the August 21, 2017 minutes – Motion by Andy H. and seconded by Lindsey C. to approve the August minutes. Motion carried.
3. Treasurer's Report – Fred E reviewed the balance sheet indicating there's not much change. Money from line 254.8 will be used to finish work on the men's room. On the profit/loss report pledges are down but giver of record amount is up. The plan is to try to have a tentative budget by 11/1. Discussion held regarding the amount in Fr. Oscar's discretionary fund. Fr. Rozo is planning use approximately \$1000 for local programs. Suggestions were made to use the funds for the Episcopal Disaster Relief, Dodge County Food pantry and Volunteer Dodge, a new resource for locating needed volunteers. Motion by Jody L to approve the August financial report as presented and seconded by Jim M.
4. Old Business -
 - a. Vestry pictures – Ken P. will take pictures of Vestry members. It was decided that individual pictures will make member changes easier. Fr. Oscar also requested a group picture. Discussion then went to the number of Vestry spots which will need to be filled in 2018. Besides the 3 people whose terms are up, Lindsey C., Sue K., and Linda Z., Stephanie M. is moving out of the area and Meredith Harmon is interested in coming back on. That would mean Andy H. would not continue and Chris C. stated she may not continue as well. That would be 6 possible openings. Also Ken P. will not be running for his 3rd term as Jr. Warden. Fr. Oscar encouraged everyone to start considering candidates to fill the spots.
 - b. Columbarium By-laws – Question was raised as to whether the new by-laws were in the packets about the columbarium. It's believed they are.
5. New Business –
 - a. Issues from Rev. Oscar, Senior Warden:
 1. Young Adult Monthly gathering – Not held last month but will resume in October. The participants are excited about these gatherings.
 2. Fall and Spring last Sunday of the month presenters at St. Mark's – a) Our identity/how is this identity matching the unchurched in Beaver Dam, b) Our mission as a church. How are we connected to the community?
 3. Kit is donating TVs, we need permission from the Vestry to install them – a) Sermons, Sunday services, motivational stories, announcements, newsletters, reports from the vestry, etc. – By consensus, it was decided to accept the donation. More discussion will be held next month after information regarding connection expenses and ongoing costs with a motion indicating where those funds will come from.

4. Training in L.A. – Fr. Oscar will be attending a training Tuesday and Wednesday this week. The training is about the Technology of Participation (ToP). This is a method of facilitation that helps groups think, talk and work together effectively, efficiently providing leaders and team members with structured methods.
5. Convocation preconception gathering – The preconception meeting is at St. Luke’s, Madison, Wednesday October 4th from 7:30 to 8:30 pm. The annual convention is Saturday, October 14th at St. John’s Military Academy in Delafield.
6. Last Sunday in September -September 24th is downstairs storage room clean up. Fr. Oscar has offered put any records that we are required to keep in an electronic format.
7. Vestry gatherings – a) How can we make them more appealing? Our work is grounded in the Spirit. Maybe more of a social time.
b) Fred indicated we no longer need to use the Diocese auditors. We can choose to use another group.

b. Junior Warden and Committee Reports

i. **Building and Grounds**

- i. Men’s room is under construction. Ken and company will do the dry wall. Plumber getting parts.
- ii. Ken P. and Dave Drexler painted the bell last week.
- iii. BDFD came through and inspected the building. We passed with flying colors. Ken is putting up smoke detectors.
- iv. Ken will be taking pictures of valuable items for insurance.
- v. Jim M. donated an air conditioner for Fr. Oscar’s office.
- vi. Once the storeroom is cleaned out the walls will come down and what’s left in the storage area will be stored in the loft area.

ii. **Other Committee Reports – No other committee reports.**

iii. **Other New Business –**

- i. If people want something in the next newsletter get it to Joanne E. as soon as possible.
- ii. Cookie sale will be 12/9. More discussion next month.
- iii. Blessing of the Animals will be October 1. The community is welcome to attend. Discussion about holding service outside weather permitting.


